# **'Peoples Ponderings'**

We have now started our Lenten journey as we prepare to celebrate the great feast of Easter. It is a time when we make a concerted effort to come closer to the Lord, with the tradition of giving things up. It is also a time when we should seek the loving mercy of God. Over the few years that I have been a priest, I have sadly heard of many people who no longer go to the Sacrament of Confession, it can be for many reasons but the main two would be; a bad experience of confession or not seeing the need to confess to a priest 'I can tell God myself'.

For those who have had a bad experience, I can only apologise. Because confession should always be a sacrament of joy, as we become aware of the loving mercy of God. If you ever go to confession and don't feel better afterwards, it's not God's fault, it's not your fault – it is the Priest's fault! So I would encourage you to give this Sacrament another chance this Lent. To not allow that bad experience to deprive you of this amazing encounter with God.

For those who feel no need to confess to a priest, 'I can tell God I am sorry myself'. It is important to remember that the Sacraments that God has given his Church, all have human interaction. In Confession it is God who you are confessing to, and God is then using the Priest to reassure you that your sins have been forgiven and to give some guidance in how to do better.

We can all say sorry to God in the privacy of our rooms, but we are left with an awkward silence after, which then leads to doubts – did God hear me? Has he forgiven me? Whereas in confession we hear those amazing words – 'Your sins are forgiven'. No doubts, no worries – just the knowledge of God's love and Mercy.

So I pray that many of you will use this season of Lent as a chance to revisit the Sacrament of Confession and to return to the loving embrace of God. If you have any questions or worries about this Sacrament please come and speak to myself or Fr Emmanuel.
