The Sign of the Cross

We start all of our personal prayers and the celebration of Mass with the Sign of the Cross. Yet it is something that we can do so naturally that we can forget what a powerful thing it is. The sign of the Cross, is a confession of our faith, a renewal of our baptism, a mark of discipleship and an accepting of suffering. It is also a mark of ownership, it reminds us that we belong to the Trinitarian God. Making this mark over our bodies, we offer up all that we have our thoughts, our words, our heart to God, that we live in and through the Trinity. We are part of the mystical body of Christ and the Sign of the Cross is our membership card.
