28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection: Isaiah 25:6-10

The reading begins with the image of the messianic banquet, the banquet which the Lord is preparing for the end of time, an image which Jesus takes up in the gospel story of the wedding-feast. After the first lines the image changes to the removal of the mourning veil and the destruction of death, every tear wiped away. In the earlier parts of the Bible the dead are thought to lead a wretched existence in Sheol, a life which is no life, a sort of half existence without power or substance, when the dead cannot praise God. Gradually Israel comes to realise that God's love is so enveloping and so enduring that God cannot desert or abandon his faithful even in death. Even death cannot cut off the faithful from God. This is one of the crucial passages where the permanent saving strength of God's love is expressed. Speaking to the Sadducees (who did not believe in the resurrection) Jesus will say "God is the God not of the dead but of the living". Paul will say "Neither death nor life can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus." HW

Please stay at home if you, or someone in your household, displays symptoms of Covid-19

In accordance with the Diocesan directive a 2 metre social distancing policy has been implemented in our Churches. This means that only a limited number of worshippers can attend Mass and the Sacraments. As the Sunday obligation continues to be suspended, please consider attending a weekday Mass instead of a weekend Mass, if you are able to do so. This will allow parishioners with work and school commitments on weekdays to be able to attend a Mass at the weekend. Seats at the weekday masses are allocated on a 'first come, first served' basis and there are usually spare seats remaining at these Masses.

By law, you must now wear a face covering in places of worship

You do not need to wear a face covering if you have a legitimate reason not to. This includes (but is not limited to):

- young children under the age of 11 (Public Health England do not recommend face coverings for children under the age of 3 for health and safety reasons)
- not being able to put on, wear or remove a face covering because of a physical or mental illness or impairment, or disability
