Report on the Synod Discussions in our area given at the Deanery Synod Meeting on 25th January by Fr Matthew Jakes.

We felt the timing and the deadline for the end of discussions was very short, and did not allow enough time for proper discussion, especially in the time of the pandemic.

We in the end had three meetings over the whole area, one in Scunthorpe, one in Crowle and one in Gainsborough. This meant that everybody had the chance to attend at least one meeting. However, the disadvantage was a lack of continuity of attendees. It was difficult with our geography to think how else it could have been carried out given the brief time frame.

In the discussions various themes emerged out of hundreds of different ideas. There were some recurring suggestions:

- To reform the priesthood to allow for more married clergy/female clergy.
- To allow priests to stay in position for longer so that there is more stability.
- To find ways to welcome our young people back to church and keep them in church.
- To have retreats.
- To develop prayer groups.
- To make more of our pilgrimages to places like Melwood.
- To re-examine church teaching on the area of contraceptives and sexual morality.
- To return to a Church where there is more certainty about teaching and belief, and more traditional worship.
- To look at ways of making church life greener and more sustainable.
- To get back to tea and coffee after Mass.
- To create an inventory of parish volunteers.
- To allow for more flexibility with the use of services of word and communion.
- To make the church a more welcoming place for the marginalized such as gay people, the divorced, the disabled, ethnic minorities etc.

Obviously, some of these suggestions are very achievable, whereas others are beyond the scope of one parish or even a diocese to decide, and indeed contradict each other. Nevertheless, I commend all who took part in the discussions. The atmosphere was always cordial and respectful of others in the spirit of the Synod.

Taking all these considerations into account, we have decided to go for two aims which are both achievable and also recurred very frequently in the discussions:

- To work on providing more for our young people in parish life.
- To look at ways of making church life greener and more sustainable.

Returning to the point I made at the beginning, the consultation has been too brief, and the time period should have been extended beyond the pandemic. I would personally have liked the process to have been sufficiently long to enable each of our four church communities within the North Lincolnshire pastoral area to have developed two of their own future aims relevant to their own circumstances and situation. Therefore, I extend the invitation to our churches to continue in discussion, with the aim of developing two aims for each church community for the development of their future mission.
