
THE WORD

Today is Trinity Sunday, the beautiful feast in which we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity. This is the mystery of the three-inone God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Like all mysteries, it is one that is hard to grasp. Each member of the Trinity is a separate and distinct person: the Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Father; the Holy Spirit is neither the Father nor the Son. Each is God, yet still there is only one God. How can this be?

It is certainly a mystery. One way of trying to understand it is to reflect on St John's definition of God: "God is love" (1 John 4:8). In the Trinity, we get a wonderful understanding of what it means to say God is love. We get a perfect insight into the inner life of God

The three persons in the Holy Trinity are three distinct persons, but they are so in love with each other, so wrapped up in each other, so close to one another, that they are perfectly one. Their communion is so strong, their intimacy so great that the three become one, while never losing their individuality. God is an eternal exchange of infinite love.

The relationships in the Trinity are the model for the relationships we must have as Christians. We too must relate to each other as a community of love, unity and harmony. Not just at the level of our own family and close relatives and friends but at the wider parish and community level as well. ■

REFLECT

n the Old Testament there was no real awareness of the Holy Trinity. For the Jews, God was one person, the Lord, and that is how they understood and related to him. This period in our salvation history is sometimes referred to as the era of God the Father.

With Christ's coming among us, we were given a deeper insight into the reality of God. Jesus frequently spoke of the close relationship that existed between himself and his Father. He prayed to the Father, and even said that he and the Father were one. This period when Jesus was physically present with us is sometimes described as the era of God the Son.

Jesus also spoke of the Holy Spirit and promised that he would send the Spirit to be with us. When, after his ascension into heaven, he did send the Holy Spirit, the full story of God's inner life was revealed: God is one and God is three, a triune God. Today, you could say we are living in the era of the Holy Spirit, who is the presence of God among us until the Lord's second coming at the end of time.

CAV

"Lord, help me and my family to live like the three persons of the Blessed Trinity, united in love.

LEARN

What does it mean to live the life of the Trinity? In his letter to the Galatians, Paul spells out the fruits of the Holy Spirit. These include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness and self-control. These are the concrete results of living the life of the Trinity. To live like that is to live the life of the Trinity.

DO

Make the sign of the cross at the beginning and end of each day and before and after each meal. Make sure always to do it slowly and carefully. Think about what it means.

PRAY

Each of us is called to love God and our neighbour with all our mind, heart, soul, and strength. Pray today to be able to love like that.

Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also, the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.

God, for ever and ever.
