Catechism:

The Veneration of Sacred Images

The Book of Deuteronomy strictly forbad the creation of a image of God or any figure (Deut 4:15~16). Nevertheless, th Old Testament did permit the creation of images which point ed towards the salvation to come in Christ, such as the cheru bim in the Holy of Holies and the bronze serpent of Moses. In the eighth century there arose the Iconoclast Controversy in which the Church was split between those who were in favour of sacred images in churches and those against based on the Old Testament prohibition. The seventh ecumenical Council at Nicaea (787) justified the veneration of icons (Greek word for images) of Christ, the angels and saints. It argued that by becoming incarnate, Jesus Christ had revealed the hidden face of God, and that now it was possible to use sacred images in worship. The Christian veneration of images is not contrary to the first commandment, which forbids idols. This is because the honour rendered to an image passes to the one represented: "Whoever venerates an image venerates the person portrayed in it." The honour paid to sacred images is respectful veneration, not adoration, which is due to God alone. (See Catechism paras 2129-2132).

Livestreaming of Masses - St Bernadette's Church

Livestreamed services have now begun with the Sunday 11:30 am Mass at St Bernadette's being livestreamed each week. During filming a fixed view of the Altar and Sanctuary will be visible, and also the backs of people occupying the seats on the front five rows - closest to the central aisle.

The livestream feed will be censored to respect your privacy at moments during services such as communion and the children's liturgy, when individuals are at the front of the Church. Participants who will be visible in the Sanctuary during a livestreamed service includes Clergy, Altar servers, Readers, and Eucharistic Ministers so it is important that consent to be filmed/withdrawing consent is obtained.
