First Reading Exodus 24:3-8

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed. Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey. Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. This he said is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules. **The Word of the Lord.**

Second Reading Hebrews 9:11-15

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God. He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Gospel Reading Mark 14:12~16.22-26

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover. And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives. The Gospel of the Lord.

Deanery Update

At the open Deanery Meeting last month people from all the parishes of our Deanery considered the question of how we could manage with one less priest. It soon became clear that there would be implications for weekend Mass times in all the parishes of the Deanery. It also became clear that it wasn't just a problem for the future, but that even now priests were finding it difficult to get supply cover when they need to be away and that it would be good to arrange our Masses in such a way that they be covered with one priest less should that be necessary on any weekend. The Deanery Clergy met soon after the open meeting to consider the matter further and they agreed that any solution must meet the following three criteria:

- * That the Deanery is able to cover for the absence of one priest and not be dependent on outside help.
- * That the number of Masses needed in each parish based on current Mass attendance are: 3 at St Bernadette's, 2 at Holy Souls, 1 each at Barton, Brigg, Crowle, and Gainsborough.
- * That any changes made now will also fit with plans for the future when we anticipate there only being three priests in the Deanery and we would have to consider how two priests could cover all the Masses.

What might that mean in practice for Holy Souls? The clergy did look closely at a particular proposal which would mean that in the near future Sunday morning Masses in Scunthorpe would be rearranged so that one priest could comfortably cover both Holy Souls and St Bernadette's, and in the longer term when there is a priest less in the Deanery there would only be two Masses at Holy Souls so that the priest based at Holy Souls could also provide a Mass at Crowle. However this is only one proposal and we would be happy to consider alternative proposals as long as they met the above criteria. We have a further clergy meeting later this month and we plan to have an open meeting in the autumn which we hope might bring the matter to a conclusion.
