Second Reading

1 Peter 3:18~22

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects. Deanery Lenten Programme

The word 'Lent' comes from the old English word 'lencten' (meaning spring) and refers to the lengthening of 7.30 pm):

spring) and refers to the lengthening of days that occurs at this time of year in the northern hemisphere. As the natural world undergoes rebirth and renewal during this season, so Lent is a time for Christians to reflect on our rebirth in Baptism and engage in spiritual renewal in preparation for Easter. To help us in that task, the 'landscape' and worship of the Church is noticeably different. Purple vestments are worn, hymns and songs are more reflective in nature, the *Gloria* is not sung at the Sunday Eucharist and the Hebrew word 'alleluia' (meaning 'Praise God) is also omitted from the Liturgy. Lent is 40 days long counting from Ash Wednesday and comes to its climax with Holy or Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the Saturday before Easter Sunday. The six Sundays during Lent are not counted because Sunday is always a celebration of the Resurrection. The 40 days help us to identify with Jesus, who spent 40 days of fasting and prayer in the wilderness before beginning his public ministry.
